Press Release

Results of voter scoring on the fulfillment of elected official's performance against priority benchmarks for Kampot Province¹

(Translated in December 14, 2010)

A sample of 100 voters² from districts in Kampot province (30% women) representative of communities including: forestry non-governmental organizations, businesspersons, civil servants, students, and farmers, reported on their satisfaction with the performance of Kampot's elected officials in relation to implementing the priority benchmarks for the province. In the majority of cases these benchmarks were felt not to have been achieved.

The majority of voters scored achievement of benchmarks as 'not at all accomplished' including: 'provide lawyers free of charge for poor people', 'punish all forestry authorities, armed forces and officials who participate in illegal deforestation', 'reduce the price of phone calls', 'repair the dam', 'lower the price of gasoline', and that 'credit institutions should provide an interest rate of 1% per month'.

No benchmarks were scored as 'almost' or 'completely' accomplished. However, the following were scored as 'moderately' accomplished: 'repair irrigation systems', 'provide training in the marketing of agricultural products', 'fisheries authority to recognize and register the fishing community group', 'increase salary of teachers', 'create a vocational training centre for street children'.

Following constituent feedback, Kampot's Parliamentarians, H.E. Mrs Mou Sokhua, H.E. Mr Khuy Sean, provincial councilor, H.E Mr. Ouk Savuth, and, provincial hall officer, Mr. Nget Saveurn promised to bring voter's concerns to the attention of the relevant stakeholders and work towards achieving benchmarks.

The breakdown for the scoring on the accomplishment of benchmarks made by voters was as follows:

- 1 'Not-at-all' or 'slightly' accomplishment (0% to 20 %)
- 2 'Moderately' (21% to 40%)
- 3 'Average' (41% to 60%)
- 4 'Largely' (61% to 80%)
- 5 'Almost' or 'Completed' (81 to 100%)

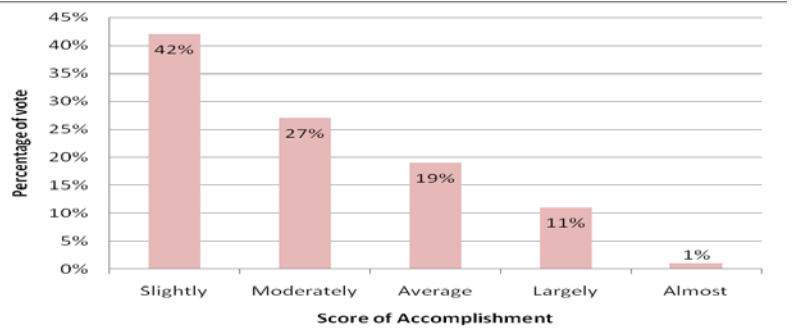

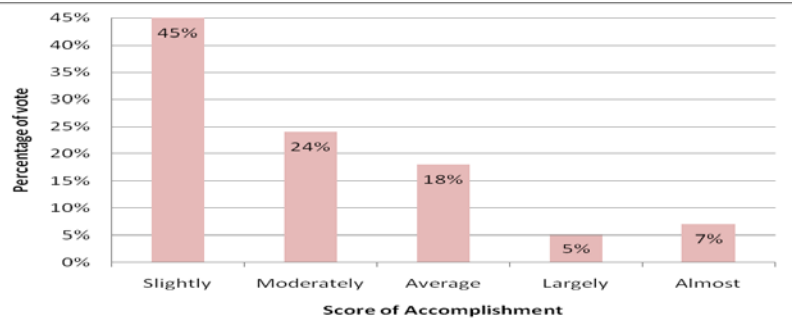

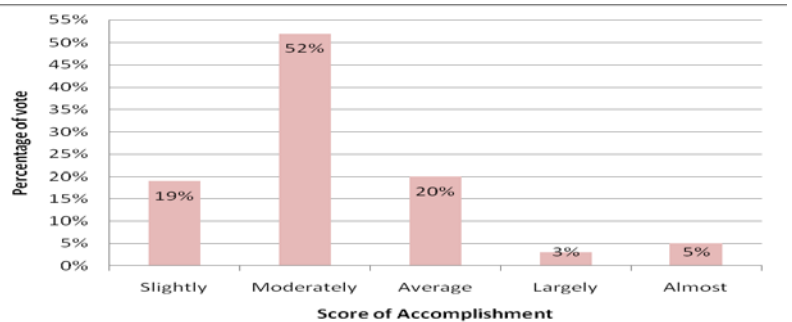
5. Punish all forestry authorities, armed forces and elite officials who participate in illegal deforestation in Kampot starting from 2009.



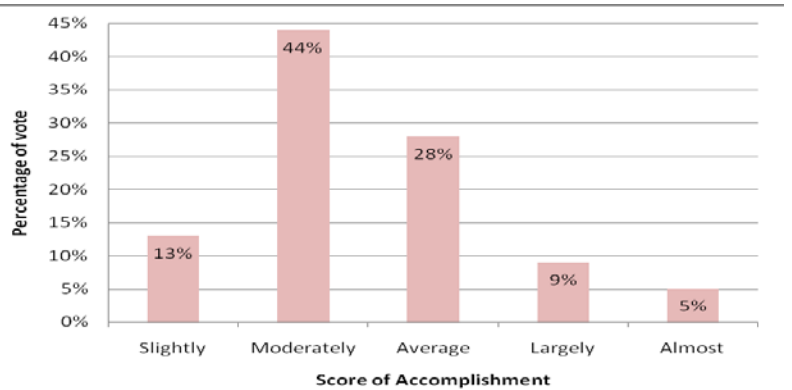
6. Reduce the price of phone calls to 3 cents (USD) per minute for calls across networks. All district offices should have a free of charge internet connection for use by local people in all 7 districts including Kampot city, the connection should be ready in 2011.



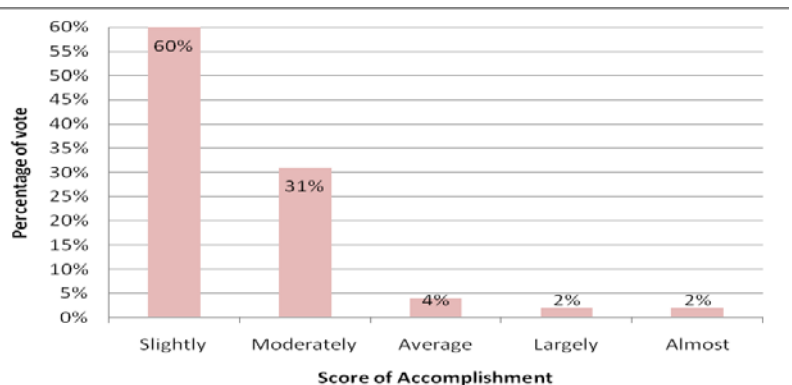
7. Increase the salary of teachers by 45% per year.



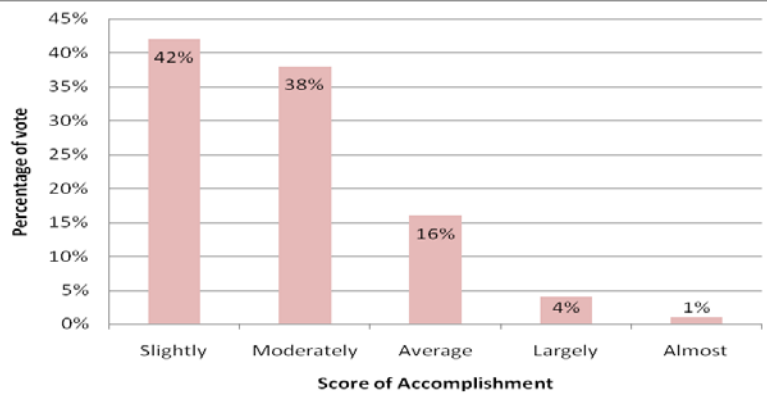
8. Create a vocational training centre with 2 buildings (sewing and motor repair workshops) for street children and the unemployed in Kampot. This building to be ready by 2012.



9. Repair the dam at Koh Toch commune, Teuk Chhou district in Kampot. Lower the price of gasoline to 2000 Riels per litre and the price of oil to 1000 Riels per litre.



10. All credit institution should provide an interest rate of 1% per month and educated people about loans before lending starting from 2010.



11. How are you satisfied overall with the work of elected officials toward the accomplishment of the benchmarks?



The voters' scores were taken in a Voters' Forum organized by COMFREL in cooperation with Cambodia Human Rights and Development Association (ADHOC), Youth Council Center (YCC) and Children and women Development Center in Cambodia (CWDCC) in 09 July 2010.
