Press Release

Results of voter scoring on the fulfillment of elected official's performance against priority benchmarks for Siem Reap Province¹

(Translated December 13, 2010)

A sample of 85 voters² from districts in Siem Reap province (36% women) representative of communities including: forestry, fisheries non-governmental organizations, businesspersons, civil servants, students, and farmers reported on their satisfaction with the performance of Siem Reap's elected officials in implementing the priority benchmarks for the province. In the majority of cases these benchmarks were felt to be 'not at all' or 'slightly achieved'.

The majority of voters have not been satisfied with the progress of officials in achieving these benchmarks. Areas of particular dissatisfaction include: 'provide social land concessions to the landless', 'increase government salaries', 'reform the legal system so that it is independent and fair', 'reduce the price of electricity', 'compensate the people living in Varin district' and especially 'end the confiscation of farm land from people in the Apsara authority area'.

No benchmarks were evaluated by voters as 'almost accomplished' or 'accomplished'. Benchmarks scored by voters as 'moderately accomplishment' include: 'put an end to the sex industry', 'halt all illegal fishing' and 'provide an agricultural technical training'

Following constituent feedback, Siem Reap's parliamentarian H.E. Mrs Ke Sovannroth said that "To represent voters I will make an effort to help." Adding that, "she is determined to continue to achieve the needs of voters."

H.E. Mr Kau Sophorn, Siem Reap's provincial councilor, promised to. "Submit the benchmarks to the board of provincial governors to discuss and take an action on."

Mr. Ly Samrith, provincial city hall officer, said he supports, "the efforts of the local authority to stop the importation of poor quality products and calls for people stop using these products."


The breakdown of the scoring by voters on the accomplishment of benchmarks made was as followings:

- 1 'Not-at-all' or 'slightly' accomplishment (0% to 20 %)
- 2 'Moderately' (21% to 40%)
- 3 'Average' (41% to 60%)
- 4 'Largely' (61% to 80%)
- 5 'Almost' or 'Completed' (81 to 100%)




